**The Dodd-Frank Act**

Just as the Glass-Steagall Act of 1933 was created in response to the Great Depression of the late 1920s, the Dodd-Frank Act was passed in 2010 in reaction to the financial crisis of 2008. The act established new government agencies tasked with implementing various reforms to decrease risks within the country’s financial system.

Main provisions of the Dodd-Frank Act.

1. Larger reserves and stress tests are required for banks. The Act increases the amount of capital banks must hold in reserve to absorb loan losses in any future economic downturn. In addition, the nation’s largest banks are subject to annual stress tests to assure survival of a severe crisis as in 2008.

2. A key component of Dodd-Frank is the Volcker Rule under which commercial banks are forbidden from running trading operations and engaging in certain speculative activity. This effectively separates the investment and commercial functions of a bank.

3. The implementation of the fiduciary rule, which requires brokers to act in the best interest of their clients when counselling them about retirement.

4. The Act established the Consumer Financial

Protection Bureau, which, among other activities, prevents mortgage brokers from earning higher compensation for closing loans with higher fees and/or higher interest rates. Additionally, mortgage originators cannot steer potential borrowers to loans that result in the highest payment for the originator. The Bureau also regulates credit cards and loans as well as mortgages.

5. The Act also established the Office of Credit Ratings at the SEC which oversees rating agencies like Moody's and Standard & Poor's. These agencies contributed to the 2008 economic crisis by overrating bundled securities such as mortgage-backed securities misleading investors as to the riskiness of the security.

The Current Status of Dodd-Frank

Since the 2016 election, the present administration and Republican lawmakers have intensified their efforts to repeal Dodd-Frank claiming the act is hurting banks and consumers, and stymying economic growth. They proposed a new act, known as the financial Choice Act, that would result in the following:

1 A significant reduction in the authority of the Consumer Protection Bureau.

2 Elimination of the Volker Rule, which restricts banks from engaging in certain speculative activity.

3 Elimination of the Labor Department's fiduciary rule, which requires brokers to act in the best interest of their clients when counseling them about retirement.

On June 8, 2017, the Choice Act passed in the House of Representatives. It is now up to the Senate to decide if this Act becomes law.



Of interest:

I did a little research on Boynton Beach and came up with some facts regarding the history .

In 1894, one year after the last Barefoot Mailman walked along its sandy shores and two years before Henry Flagler built his famous railroad, a former Civil War major from Port Huron, Michigan named Nathan S. Boynton first set eyes on the area that now bears his name. He was so impressed by the natural beauty of what he saw, the year-round sunshine and pristine beaches, that he returned a year later with a group of colonists and built the famous Boynton Beach Hotel to serve as his family's summer residence.

Boynton Beach remained a fairly unknown tropical paradise known for its perfect weather and delicious produce until the end of World War II.

Soldiers returning home from the war discovered that the small town located only 50 miles north of Miami was an extraordinarily healthy place to raise a family. With the population growing, the best kept secret on Florida's Gold Coast was no longer a secret. Since that time, Boynton Beach has grown steadily. The city's population has risen from 5,000 in 1958 to a present number of more than 68,000 residents (2010 census).

Major Boynton and his colorful hotel have long passed into the annals of history, but the irresistible qualities that attracted him and the city's first settlers remain as strong as ever to entice a new generation of visitors and residents.





**Bridge - Try It, You'll Like It - Counting and Eliminating Losers**

By: Lew Roth (Sheffield)

This season I am going to start out with explaining several count techniques that may help you decide which way to go. For example, everyone knows you need 13 points to open the bidding for your side. However you will see many good players open with 12 sometimes, but pass other times with 12 points. Why is that?

The answer is called the Rule of 20. When trying to decide if you should open or not, first look at the position you are in at the table. If you are in third position, 12 is more than enough to open because you already know that the first 2 players don't have opening hands. If you are in fourth position a different rule applies which we will come back to in a subsequent article.

So let's just consider the holding of 10 to 12 points sitting in the first or second position. The rule of 20 says that you count the number of high card points (HCP) and add to that the length of your 2 longest suits. If that comes to 20 or more you should open.

Let's look at some examples:

	Spades	Hearts	Diamonds	Clubs
1.	A,K,4,3	Q,J,3	Q,4,3	7,5,3
2.	A,K,4,3	Q,J,3	7,4,3	K,5,3
3.	A,K,4,3,2	Q,J,3	Q,4,3	7,5
4.	A,K,4,3,2	Q,J,4,3	4, 3,2	7
5.	A,K,4,3,2	Q,J,4,3,2	4,3	7
6.	7,5,4,2	A, K, 2	Q, J, 3, 2	Q,7

1. PASS You have 12 HCP and the length of your 2 longest suits is 7. That gives you 19...not enough to open. Further, you don't have a good suit to open. All the more reason to pass.

2. Bid 1♣ You have 13 points. Always open with 13 points no matter what the length of your suits.

3. Bid 1♠ You have 12 HCP and the length of your 2 longest suits is 8. That gives you 20. Since you have a 5 card major, you open 1♠. What would you do if you didn't have a 5 card major, but did have enough to open under the rule of 20?

4. PASS You have 10 HCP and the length of your 2 longest suits is 9. That gives you 19 ... not quite enough to open. Some people would be tempted to open with this hand since you have a rebid. If you are not

vulnerable and feel lucky, you might open this hand 1♠, hoping you and your partner have a fit in spades or hearts. If you do, this hand would be re-evaluated to 13 points after counting the singleton club.

5. Bid 1♠ You have 10 HCP and 10 cards in your 2 longest suits. That total of 20 allows you to make a bid. Remember though when you have 5 cards in each of two suits, bid the higher ranking one first.

6. Bid 1♦ You have 12 HCP and 8 cards on your longest 2 suits for a total of 20, so you should bid. Some people would be very reluctant to bid with this hand, especially when vulnerable, because you might not have a convenient rebid. Let's say you bid 1♦ and your partner responds with 1♥. You cannot bid 2♥ with only 3. So you have to say 1 NT. That is not a good bid because you don't have a Spade honor and you only have 2♣.

This rule, like many others, is a guideline for successful bidding. It doesn't always work out. That's what makes bridge such an interesting game.

Welcome back to another season of trying to figure out what's become of the world of professional and college sports we all grew up with and loved.

Let's start with losers. Somewhere, somethen it became a good thing to lose. Franchises plan for losing; execute losing and even celebrate losing. Once Vince Lombardi told us: "Winning isn't everything, it's the only thing. Five decades later: Winning isn't everything, losing is an acceptable alternative."

Professional teams in baseball, football, basketball and hockey deliberately weaken their rosters to increase the chances of losing. This has come to be called "tanking." It's become an art form for some sports executives who "tank" for a measured purpose.

Saving payroll is the obvious goal but the ultimate purpose is to improve the team's draft status in terms of a higher draft slot or number of draft choices. You know a baseball is tanking when it barter a star player for another team's top prospects.

Good tankers become successful. Bad tankers keep their teams and fans in an eternal abyss. The Houston Astros are good tankers. They had baseball's worst record for three straight seasons -- 2011-13 -- then

traded all their good players for top prospects, used their three No. 1 draft choices brilliantly, and now are the American League's strongest team.

Meanwhile, the San Diego Padres haven't challenged in a decade averaging almost 20 games out of first place during that time period. But the Padres' braintrust never figured out how to be bad enough to become relevant.

Tanking was alive during our childhood too. Recall the Kansas City Athletics, who traded or sold every Major League-caliber they developed to the Yankees (Roger Maris, Ryne Duren, Clete Boyer, Hector Lopez, Ralph Terry, et al; for has-beens, no-names and minimal dollars).

Hockey's Pittsburgh Penguins tanked twice to be champions. In the 1983 season, they lost games down the stretch to get the No. 1 draft pick Mario Lemieux and rode him to 2 Stanley Cup titles. In 2005, after another bad stretch, they tanked for the next budding superstar, Sidney Crosby, got him, and have taken

home 3 more Cups.

Today tanking is rampant.

New York Jets fans have nothing to root for this season except for their team to finish as close to 0-16 as possible and grab the No. 1 pick in the draft. A local newspaper publishes a weekly chart for the nation's top 3 college quarterback prospects so fans can follow what the jackpot will be for the Jets' ultimate failure. New York Mets fans had nothing to root for in 2017 when the team's playoff hopes were ravaged by injury. In July, the team started tanking. They traded or sold almost every veteran on the roster for a handful of second-tier prospects at reliever and reduced the payroll by about \$20 million. Will they reinvest that money in 2018 and capitalize on a better draft slot? The fans can only root.

The NBA is the only league to dispel tanking, but it's got a different problem. The NBA instituted a stop-tanking draft lottery so worst-record team didn't



**Historic Event: Part I. Overview**

The U.S. declared war with Britain on June 18, 1812. The War of 1812 had begun. USS CONSTITUTION was at sea. On Aug. 19, she sighted the British frigate HMS GUERRIERE off Halifax and the Gulf of Saint Lawrence and chased after her. Captain Isaac Hull surprised the British with his heavier broadside firing and his ship’s sailing ability. Adding to their astonishment, many of the British shots had rebounded harmlessly off CONSTITUTION’s hull. An American sailor reportedly shouted “Huzzah! Her sides are made of iron.” CONSTITUTION thus earned the nickname “Old Ironsides.” When the ship arrived back in Boston on Aug. 30, Captain Hull and his crew found that the news of their victory had spread fast and they were hailed as heroes.

Launched in 1797, CONSTITUTION is a wood-hulled, three-masted heavy frigate of the U.S. Navy. She was named by President George Washington after the Constitution of the U.S. The ship is the world’s oldest commissioned naval vessel afloat. CONSTITUTION was one of six original frigates authorized by Congress to begin forming the new U.S. Navy. Shipbuilder Joshua Humphreys designed the frigates to be capital ships so they were larger and more heavily armed than frigates before. She was built from the resilient Southern live oak from GA. Her 3 masts were made from the strong white pine of Maine. Humphreys designed her hull at 22 inches

thick at the waterline. He added copper sheathing below the waterline to protect it against ship worms that could damage the wooden hull. CONSTITUTION was built in a shipyard in the north end of Boston.

Her first duties were to protect American merchant shipping during the Quasi-War with France and to defeat the Barbary pirates. She is most noted for her actions in the War of 1812 when she captured numerous British merchant ships and defeated five

of their warships, most notably HMS GUERRIERE. The public admiration for “Old Ironsides” has repeatedly saved her from being scrapped.

During the Civil War, she served as a training ship for midshipmen of the U. S. Naval Academy.

The ship was retired from active service in 1881 and served as a receiving ship for naval recruits until designated a museum ship in 1907. She sailed under her own power for her 200th birthday in 1997. And sailed again in Aug. 2012 to commemorate the 200th anniversary of her historic victory over HMS GUERRIERE.

As a fully commissioned and U.S. Navy ship, her crew of 60 officers and sailors participate in ceremonies, educational programs, and special events. All the crew is on active duty. Their assignment is considered to be a special duty honor.

One crewman said he had an incredible feeling to be on CONSTITUTION, a ship that is 219 years old. Sam Cox, director of Naval History and Heritage Command, noted that “CONSTITUTION was

### Here to Help

#### How to Pack a Suitcase

Follow these five basic tips to pack efficiently and effectively for any trip.


**Limit your size.** The bigger the suitcase, the more you’ll put into it. Buy a hard-sided suitcase, at most 22 inches tall (so it can work as a carry-on) with a structured shell so you can’t squeeze in any extras.

**Do the clothing countdown.** To help streamline your wardrobe, use the 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 rule for a week long trip: Limit yourself to five sets of socks and underwear, four tops, three bottoms, two pairs of shoes and one hat. (Adjust the list to suit your needs.) Throw in a swimsuit and exercise gear or a suit jacket and dress if you’ll need them.

**Lay out what you think you’ll need, then edit ruthlessly.** “Fully get rid of the ‘just in case I need it’ category,” said the travel blogger Ben Nickel-D’Andrea. “If and when you need it, you can buy it.”

**Think Tetris.** Fill every inch of space. Footwear can be stuffed with socks; lay your shoes together heel to toe at the bottom of your suitcase in a plastic shopping bag to protect clothes from

dirt. You can also roll your clothes - this helps to maximize space and minimize wrinkles. Use packing cubes, which help keep your clothes compact and your outfits ordered. Or try the bundle technique: Carefully wrap each article around a central core, with underwear and T-shirts at the center, and large tailored items like blazers and dresses as the outer layer.



**Never unpack your toiletries.** “I recommend keeping a separate toiletry kit for traveling,” said the decluttering guru Marie Kondo. Keeping a set of bathroom products already packed also ensured that you don’t forget a toothbrush or contact lens case that you might use the morning of takeoff. To save space, consider all-in-one options like BB creams, which combine foundation, moisturizer and sunblock. To prevent leakage, double up that plastic gab. And keep it at the top of your suitcase for easy access during the security checks.



to really meet each other. "Neighborhood Watch" became so successful because people became involved and really cared about each other. It is never too late to engage with the people around you.

3. **Assess your home's vulnerability.** Walk to the curb and face your house. Ask yourself "How would I get in if I were locked out?" The first thing you think of, whether it's the window with a broken lock or the door that won't shut all the way, is exactly how a thief will get in. Think like a burglar, and then address the issues that come to mind.

4. **Respect the power of lighting.** Criminals are cowards, and they don't want to be seen. The house that is well-lit at night provides a deterrent because thieves don't want the attention and the potential to be caught by witnesses. It is wise to invest in tools that make nighttime light automation easy. That includes dusk-to-dawn adapters that go into existing light fixtures and motion detectors. But beware of leaving your exterior lights on at all times, which signifies the occupant is gone for an extended period of time.

5. **Use technology to make your home look occupied.** In addition to lighting, smart-home technology has made it easier to make it appear like people are home, even when they are not. Systems that remotely control lighting, music and appliances such as a thermostat can help you achieve this. Though not considered smart-home tech, simple lamp timing devices available at hardware stores are also good for this purpose.

6. **Yes, it has to be said: Lock your doors.** It's amazing how many people think they live in a safe-enough neighborhood, not to have to lock their doors when they leave. Some facts homeowners should know: In 30 percent of burglaries, the criminals access the home through an unlocked door or window; 34 percent of burglars use the front door to get inside, and, 22 percent use the back door according to the FBI Uniform Crime Report.
